

Your child has joined MRC. Now what?

Thank you for trusting your child to the staff and volunteers of the Music Resource Center! We love to have involved parents and guardians, and would greatly appreciate your reviewing the following guidelines and policies for MRC members and parents/visitors.

Who Is Allowed At MRC?

Our program is for teens in grades 7th – 12th.

To maintain a teen-centered environment where members are comfortable, we limit access to our studios and practice spaces that exist beyond our front lobby.

Parents and/or guardians are welcome to wait for their teen in the MRC Lobby as long as they conduct themselves in a respectful manner that is not disruptive to our members, staff or programming (i.e. not talking loudly on the phone).

You can rest assured that only MRC Staff and Volunteers, who have passed a background check conducted by MRC, or approved staff of a partner agency, are allowed past the MRC Lobby. All other individuals, whether getting a tour or otherwise, are accompanied by an MRC staff or volunteer at all times. This includes parents of teens already attending MRC.

MRC Visitor Policy

- All visitors must sign in and out at the front desk. For your first visit, a photo ID must be presented.
- If you would like to listen to one of your child's songs, watch a rehearsal or sit in on a lesson, please let our Studio Coordinator know and she will see if a staff member or volunteer is available to escort you. All approved MRC Staff, Volunteers and approved partner agency staff will wear MRC identification so they are easily recognizable.
- All adult staff, volunteers and guests are asked to set a respectful and positive example of behavior for our members.
- Smoking is *not* allowed on MRC property.
- All visitors *must* enter and exit through the front door of the studio.
